A permanent transplant to the Rochester area, Heatwole graduated from Visual Studies Workshop's MFA program and worked as a managing editor of *Afterimage: The Journal of Media Arts and Cultural Criticism* while teaching in several local colleges before accepting a full-time position in the art department of Roberts Wesleyan College. She comes to us most recently from the Brockport Migrant Education

Program where she served as an outreach worker, tutor and advocate for inschool and out-of-school youth residing in the Rochester City and Brockport school districts.

The Flower City Arts Center is a community-based not-for-profit that educates, encourages and inspires all people to create and enjoy the visual arts. As a member of the National Guild of Community Schools of the Arts, the organization is committed to making high-quality arts education available to all.

Flower City Arts Center has been operating since 1970. The Center is a darkroom and photography facility, a pottery workshop, and a printing and book arts center. Three galleries in the building serve as exhibit space for local, regional and national artists.
